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ENVIRONMENTAL DATA SCIENTIST



Environmental data scientists study data on air quality, biodiversity, and climate patterns to understand how human activities affect the environment. By creating data models and forecasts, they help guide decision-making in conservation and sustainability, often working with governments and NGOs to develop data-driven policies.

Working conditions

They often work in office or lab environments, but field research may require travel and exposure to various weather conditions. Working on data can be computer-intensive and may involve long hours

Skills

Strong math and science knowledge, team working & collaboration, organisation, problem solving, willingness to learn, and programming skills

Education

A bachelor's in environmental science, Data Science, or Statistics is typical. A master's in data Analytics, Environmental Data Science, as well as proficiency in statistical programming languages, can be advantageous

Tasks

They collect and analyze large sets of environmental data, use AI to spot trends, and make reports with visuals to help explain results. They work closely with other scientists to improve data accuracy, supporting policies and decisions that help the environment

Opportunities

These roles are available in government agencies, environmental organizations, private corporations, and research institutions. They may work as employees, contractors, or independent consultants

SUSTAINABILITY MANAGER



A Sustainability Manager creates strategies for companies to minimize their environmental impact. They work on goals to reduce waste, use renewable energy, and conserve resources, ensuring that companies meet green standards and support eco-friendly initiatives within their communities

Working conditions

They work in office environments but may travel frequently to different sites or company branches. This role can involve long hours, particularly when preparing sustainability reports

Skills

Project management, team working & collaboration, leadership, problem solving, creativity/innovation, willingness to learn, adaptability-flexibility, working with numbers, environmental knowledge, communication

Education

A bachelor's degree in environmental science, business, or sustainability. A master's in Sustainability or Environmental Policy is also preferred

Tasks

They set policies, review data on the company's environmental impact, and collaborate with different departments to apply sustainable practices. They analyze waste, track energy use, conduct environmental audits, and organize events that support sustainable goals

Opportunities

Opportunities exist in corporations, environmental consultancies, government agencies, and non-profits. They can work in the private sector, public sector, or independently as consultants. They may also pursue entrepreneurial paths, creating their own sustainable consulting businesses

CLIMATE CHANGE ADAPTATION SPECIALIST



A Climate Change Adaptation Specialist helps people and communities get ready for the effects of climate change. They create plans to protect areas like farming, water, and cities, making sure these communities can adapt and stay strong through environmental changes

Working conditions

This job may include office work as well as fieldwork, which can involve outdoor conditions and travel. Specialists may work long hours, especially when coordinating emergency plans or meeting with communities impacted by climate change

Skills

Knowledge of climate science, team working & collaboration, problem solving, creativity/innovation, willingness to learn, adaptability-flexibility, working with numbers and communication

Education

A degree in Environmental Science or Public Policy is usually required. A master's degree in Climate Science, Environmental Management, or Climate Policy can provide advanced opportunities in this field

Tasks

They look at data to understand climate risks, develop plans to protect vulnerable areas, and work with local groups to put these plans into action. They regularly review the success of these projects, run educational sessions, and make updates to the plans as needed

Opportunities

There are roles in government agencies, non-profit organizations, and consulting firms. Specialists can work as employees, freelance consultants, or start their own firms, providing expertise to both public and private clients
