ALTERNATIVE DISPUTE RESOLUTION SPECIALIST



Expert in extrajudicial solutions for conflict resolution. He/She focuses on alternative methods to the traditional legal route (such as the court process) to resolve disputes, seeking to reach an agreement between the parties in conflict in a faster, cheaper and often less conflictual way through mediation, negotiation, or arbitration.

Working conditions

Works in offices, legal firms, or mediation centers, often conducting negotiations and facilitating discussions in structured settings. May require travel for hearings or dispute resolution sessions.

CYBERCRIME LEGAL SPECIALIST



Legal professional with a specialization in dealing with and solving cybercrime cases, involving digital crimes such as hacking, online fraud, identity theft, cyberstalking, and other crimes committed through the network or computer devices.

Working conditions

Works in offices, courtrooms, or law enforcement settings, often collaborating with cybersecurity experts and investigators. May require handling sensitive digital evidence and working under tight deadlines
